SOLAR PANELS





THE SIAMATIKA CLINIC

Last year, we proudly reached an important milestone: the opening of the Siamatika Clinic. Since its opening, the clinic has become a vital part of the community, and we can confidently say that the impact on the local population has been enormous.

24-Hour care

What started as a necessity has now grown into a full healthcare facility, offering 24-hour care to the community. The facilities now allow patients to stay longer and receive the care they need, which is a huge improvement compared to the situation before the clinic opened. It's heartwarming to see how well the clinic is functioning.

A well-run clinic

The clinic is being run professionally, and we are pleased to report that the government has assigned additional staff to support the healthcare team. This means there is now enough medical staff giving properly care to the patients.

Hygiene and community involvement

Another aspect we are incredibly proud of is how hygienically clean the clinic is maintained. There is a dedicated team of staff responsible for cleaning, but what's even more wonderful is the involvement of the community. Volunteers from surrounding villages contribute to ensu-

ring that the clinic stays in top condition. It's their clinic, and this sense of ownership is evident in everything they do. They consider it their responsibility, and that makes a world of difference **Nutrition for patients**

An important point is the care of patients admitted to the clinic. It's often difficult to provide enough food and drink, but fortunately, the community ensures that meals are lovingly prepared for patients, providing not only medical care but also the necessary nutrition for a quick recovery.

Solar energy for the clinic

During one of our visits to the clinic in 2024, we made sure that solar panels were installed so that the clinic doesn't run out of power, even when the local electricity supply fails. The Liberi Foundation has invested in this sustainable solution because we understand how critical it is to have a constant power supply for medical equipment, lighting, and other essentials. Thanks to the solar panels, the clinic is now able to provide continuous care.

We cannot tell enough how much of a difference the Clinic is for the community. It is not only a place for medical care but also a symbol of hope and collaboration.

OUR NEW PROJECT: HIGH SCHOOL

As mentioned in the first part of this newsletter, we are busy preparing for our **next big project**: the establishment of **secondary education** for children in Siavonga. This project started out of the urgent need for secondary education in the region. While there is indeed a demand for further schooling, there is **almost no secondary education** available in Siavonga. This means that many children, after completing their primary education, have no opportunities to continue their education and further develop their talents.

Secondary Education

After discussions with the **Ministry of Education** and other local stakeholders, it became clear that there is a great need for a **secondary school** in the region. We have had extensive consultations with the local community, the ministry, and other stakeholders to determine the best way to make this a reality. We are excited to announce that we have **received land from the Chief** of Siavonga, who has expressed his full support for the project. This allows us to establish a sustainable and future-proof school that will make a difference for generations to come.



An old factory becomes a school


In addition to the land, there is also an empty factory building. The Liberi Foundation has decided to convert this factory into a modern, well-equipped **secondary school**. We are in discussions with an architect and collaborating to create the first **designs** for the school. The idea is to create a place where children can not only learn but also discover and develop their talents, from academic and vocational subjects to sports and arts.

We have already invested a lot of time and energy in planning this project, and the first sketches of the school are starting to take shape. The school will not only offer classrooms but also space for important facilities such as **sports fields** and other amenities that contribute to the development of the children.
