Introduction

With this policy plan, Liberi Foundation provides insight into its objectives, activities, and methods for the period 2026–2030. This policy plan serves as a guideline for the execution of its activities and as an accountability document for donors, supervisory authorities, and other stakeholders.



1. About Liberi Foundation

This policy plan for the period 2026–2030 outlines the vision, objectives, and areas of operation of Liberi Foundation (hereinafter: Liberi).

Liberi Foundation was established in 2016 by Wilma Kaptijn and has been structured as a family foundation since 2026. The name Liberi means child in Latin and is also used in the sense of freedom. This twofold meaning forms the core of Liberi's work.

Liberi is committed to improving the future prospects of vulnerable children, young people, and families, both within the Netherlands (domestic) and abroad (international). By providing support in the areas of education, well-being, basic necessities, and health, Liberi contributes to structural improvements in living conditions.

This policy plan is considered a dynamic document. Liberi values flexibility and the ability to respond to current and urgent social needs.

Mission & Vision

Liberi believes that every child and every young person has the right to equal opportunities to develop, regardless of origin or socio-economic circumstances.

Mission

Liberi supports vulnerable children, young people, and families by improving access to education, well-being, basic necessities, and healthcare, with the aim of increasing independence, self-worth, and future prospects.

Vision

Liberi believes that structural support, such as education, stability, and well-being, is the most sustainable way to break the cycle of poverty. Both domestically and internationally, Liberi focuses on strengthening individuals and communities so that they can ultimately become self-reliant.

Objectives

The objectives of Liberi are:

- To support the development of vulnerable children and young people
- To promote education and educational opportunities
- To improve well-being, stability, and health
- To support families living at or below the poverty line
- To strengthen communities and social cohesion
- To promote self-reliance and sustainable impact

Strategy

Liberi achieves its objectives through:

- Domestic (The Netherlands)

Within the Netherlands, Liberi focuses exclusively on collaborating with organizations with ANBI status, whose objective is to provide structural support to vulnerable young people and families living around or below the poverty line, including by offering (sports) memberships, practical support and facilitating outings or short holidays to promote well-being, peace of mind and family stability.
- International

Abroad, Liberi is committed to realizing and supporting sustainable (public benefit) development projects, with a focus on education and healthcare. Activities include building and renovating schools and medical posts, strengthening teachers and medical staff through training and facilities, facilitating food programs and basic provisions, and actively involving local communities in the development, implementation, and safeguarding of projects.

Area of Operation

Liberi is active both domestically and internationally.

- Domestic

Within the Netherlands, Liberi works exclusively with ANBI-certified organizations that support vulnerable young people and families facing poverty, social exclusion, or unstable home situations.
- International

Internationally, Liberi focuses on structural and sustainable (public benefit) development projects in vulnerable regions where access to education, healthcare, and basic provisions is limited. Liberi works in cooperation with local governments and with the active involvement of local communities to achieve sustainable improvements.

2. Policy

Principles

- Strengthening basic skills and personal development
- Promoting well-being and stability
- Increasing self-reliance
- Working based on the needs of the target group

Preferences

Preference is given to projects that:

- Have a long-term impact
- Align with the lived reality of the target group
- Contribute to independence and self-worth
- Are carried out in collaboration with committed partners

Conditions

Liberi requires that:

- Projects address demonstrable needs
- The target group is actively involved
- Resources are used efficiently and transparently

3. Ideological Foundation

Liberi endorses the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and acts on the principle of equality. No distinction is made based on origin, gender, religion, belief, or status.

Liberi has no political or religious agenda and acts solely in the interest of the target group.

4. Communication

Liberi attaches great importance to transparency and open communication.

Liberi informs donors and interested parties through:

Each year, a substantive and financial report is published, including a balance sheet, statement of income and expenditure, and an explanation of activities.

5. Income, Expenditure, and Asset Management

Liberi's income consists mainly of gifts and donations.

All income is spent entirely on the objectives

- Board members receive no remuneration
- Assets are managed carefully and transparently
- No single board member has final decision-making authority

6. Board

The board is responsible for policy, finances, and supervision of implementation.
